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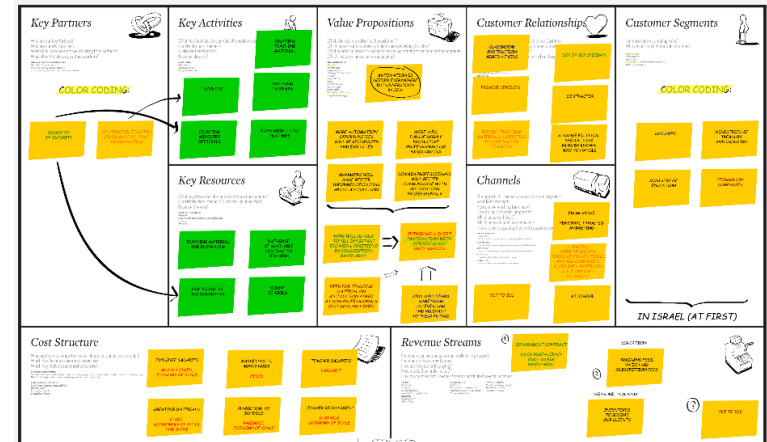

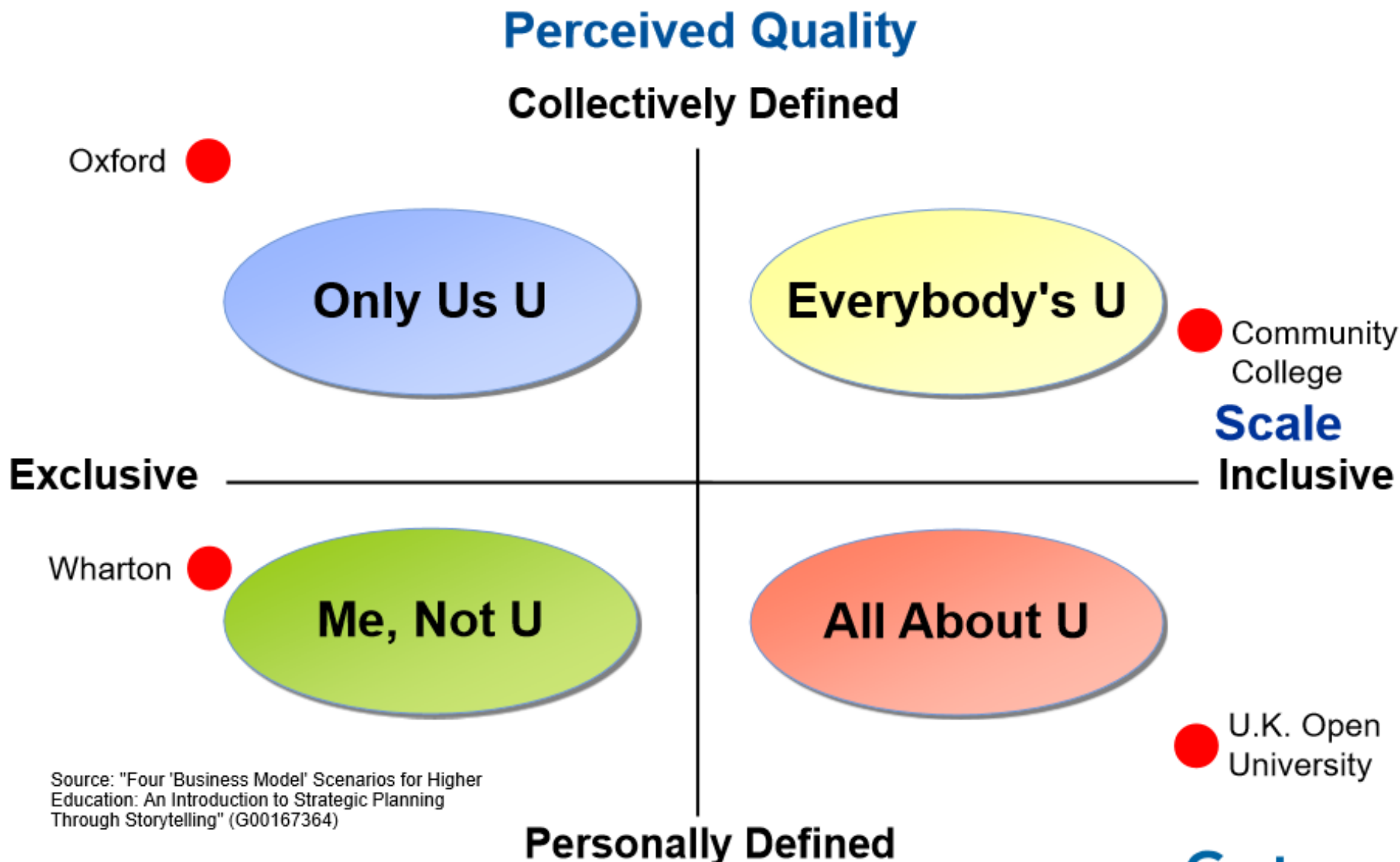


First, where is your insitution going? Your business model.

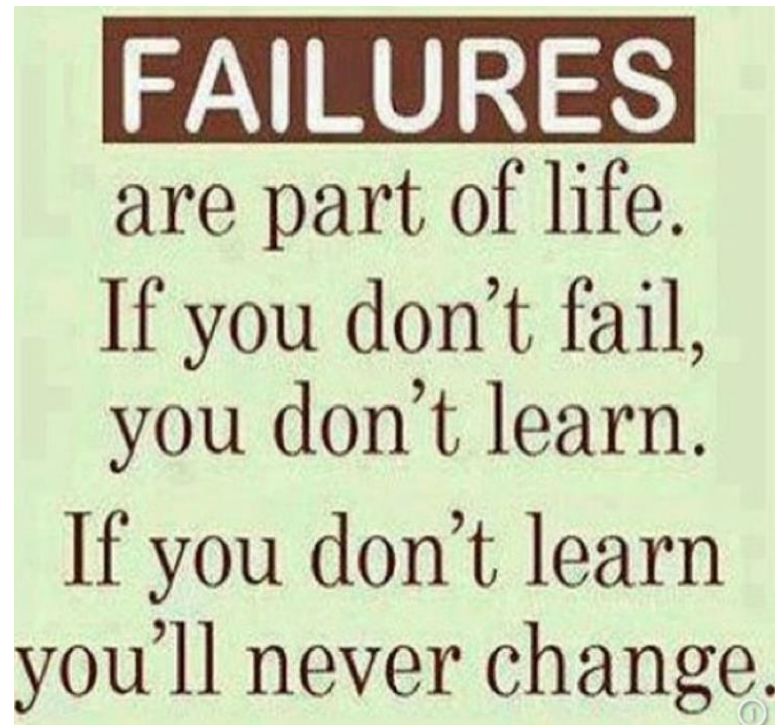
What is an IT strategy?

A **Technology strategy** is a particular generation of an organization's overall objective(s), principles and tactics relating to the technologies that the organization uses.



Your challenge

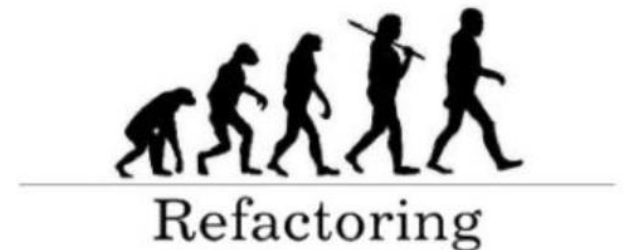
- An IT strategy for an academic institution may be one of the hardest task to prepare and implement for a CIO



What is an IT strategy?, cont.

- A book – a novel
- A sheet of paper - a formal document
- An idea in your head

- A revolution or refactoring
- Changes in directions?



- It is institutional politics

What should an IT-strategy be?

- Your IT-plan for the future, max 3 years
- Easy to understand
- Accepted by your institution and peers
- Plans and later follow-up
- Have goals related to plan
- Story-telling works !



A new IT-strategy can be a shift

- On prem - Cloud first
- Computer labs - BYOD
- Openess – tighten IT-security
- DIY – carefully prepared IT support
- Open Source - Market Solutions
- Get your own software – Campus Licenses
- Freedom - standardization



What is most important in a IT strategy for an institution?

- Network and IAM (Identity and Access Management)
- Basic services (Webb, mail, HR, Finance, Student Records)
- IT security
- Reliability and Performance
- Stability and Innovation
- Cost and benefit

When to implement a new IT-strategy

 - Change in management
 - External or internal incidents
 - Mergers or splits
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- Changes are sparks – potentials for change
