GroupMAX - Online Accommodation Booking System

How our on-line delegate accommodation booking service works:

Delegate accommodation for your event will be provided using our online accommodation booking service. This is a web-based accommodation reservation system that allows delegates to reserve accommodation from an agreed allocation of rooms selected from a list of providers chosen by you. Please be advised that our preferred conference accommodation rates carry a small commission charge to cover the provision of the system paid for by the accommodation providers.

Real-time online reservations

Room reservations are taken from the allocation automatically and the delegate receives an email confirmation detailing their booking reference number. Should the delegate need to make changes or cancel their reservation during the booking period they simply access the site, enter their booking reference number and make the changes. Rooms cancelled are immediately reinstated to the allocation automatically. After the Locked date, generally one week prior to the event, delegates would be instructed to contact the Bureau directly to make any required changes.

Delegates without access to the Internet

If delegates do not have access to the internet, a paper reservation form can be provided and forwarded to the delegate. The Bureau will then liaise directly with the delegate and forward a confirmation by email, fax or post.

Terms of Use:

Our online accommodation booking service can be provided to conferences who have identified that there is a requirement for accommodation provision.

We would also require your commitment to actively promote this service to delegates at every opportunity to ensure the service is utilised and delegates book rooms from the allocations we have secured.

Detailed below are some recommended suggestions on how you can help us promote the service to your delegates:

- Service is promoted to delegates as the official accommodation booking website for delegates attending your conference
- Displayed prominently on your conference website
- Promote the service actively to delegates on an ongoing basis via email and other mediums
- Where possible, reference is made to the service in any promotional literature
- Promote the service via any other opportunity

Dundee & Angus Convention Bureau endeavour to secure the best possible conference accommodation rates together with favourable cancellation charges. All of the accommodation providers we work with offer a 24 hour notice cancellation period without the delegate incurring any cancellation charges.

The benefit of using our online booking system is that there is no risk to you as an organisation in the event of unsold rooms or incurring cancellation charges for any unsold rooms. As part of our service, we continually monitor the bookings and will endeavour to secure additional rooms from the hotel providers. At the 6 week review date, the hotels are entitled to request back any unsold accommodation from the allocation they have provided for your event, however at this stage, we will contact you to obtain an update on registrations and if you are expecting a number of delegates still to book. We will then liaise with the hotels to retain a small allocation of rooms until the locked date has been reached, which is normally one week prior to your conference.

The closing date for the booking system is one week prior to your event, when the remaining rooms are returned to the accommodation providers. Any delegates still looking for last minute accommodation, should they click on the link for the online booking system, they will be informed that this is now closed and a message will ask them to contact the Convention Bureau for assistance. Dundee & Angus Convention Bureau will endeavour to secure accommodation for them, subject to availability.

We would inform you when the online accommodation booking system has reached locked status which means that delegates can no longer book their accommodation online. We will then send you a copy of our Delegate Accommodation Booking Form (in Word format) which you can upload onto your conference website in place of the web link so that delegates can continue to book through the Dundee & Angus Convention Bureau and still receive the preferred rates (subject to availability) for your conference.

Branding and Design

Wherever possible, all of our systems are branded by using your conference logo or you can design your own banner.






The Royal Connection (Half Day tour)

 A walking tour of Edinburgh's Royal Mile, Edinburgh Castle and The Royal Yacht Britannia

Edinburgh's 'Royal Mile', a bustling and busy cobbled street in Old Town of the city, connects the iconic Edinburgh Castle with Queen Elizabeth's official home in Scotland, Holyrood Palace. This tour takes in all 3 attractions – the Castle sitting at the top of hill at the head of the Royal Mile, the Royal Mile is a gentle walk downhill, finishing with the stunning Royal Yacht Britannia.


The tour begins at Scotland's most popular attraction, Edinburgh Castle. Sited on top of an extinct volcano, gaining stunning views across Edinburgh, the castle has witnessed many of the defining events of Scottish history. A key attraction within the castle is the Scottish Crown Jewels. The crown, sword and sceptre are amongst the oldest regalia in Europe and are displayed with the Stone of Destiny, the coronation seat of Scottish Kings.

The tiny St. Margaret's Chapel, the Royal Apartments and the Great Hall, built by James IV in 1511 are other impressive parts of the Castle to explore as well as 'Mons Meg', the cannon known as the "One o'clock Gun", fired almost every day to mark 1pm.




The Castle from Princes Street gardens

The tour continues with a walk down the Royal Mile, a treasure chest of historic gems just waiting to be opened. The guides will unfold the history of this fascinating street and reveal its unique place in the development of the Scottish nation, how the Royal Mile received its name and explore all its nooks and crannies!!





After the gentle walk down The Royal Mile, the tour will continue with a visit to The Royal Yacht Britannia, This magnificent ship has played host to some of the most famous people in the world. But, above all, she was home to Her Majesty The Queen and the Royal Family. Now in Edinburgh you are welcome on board to discover the heart and soul of this most special of royal residences. The tour of the ship includes the Drawing Room the State Dining Room, the Sun Lounge, and the gleaming Engine Room.



<u>Hopetoun House</u> (Approximately 4 hours)

• A grand Georgian and Edwardian house set in a beautiful estate



Hopetoun House is a remarkable and beautiful stately home located just outside Edinburgh on the north side. Sitting in majestic grounds and filled with stunning collections, it dates back to the 17th Century and remains the ancestral home of the Hope Family. The present Lord Hopetoun and his family still live in the house.


As visitors approach the house, the impressive panoramic view of the main façade, shown above, is breathtakingly revealed. On entering the house, the magnificent interiors reflect the elegance of the Georgian era and are decorated with the best period furniture, paintings, tapestries and clocks and beautifully crafted finishes of carving, gilding and plasterwork.





The tour begins with a 40 minute transfer from Dundee to Hopetoun House followed by a private guided tour of the house and continues into the pretty 'quaint' village of South Queensferry at the mouth of the mighty Forth River and below the iconic Forth Railway Bridge. Guests will be able to explore the cobbled streets and interesting shops before returning to Dundee





Play at the Home of Golf (Full Day)

• The Old Course, St Andrews

The Old Course is the 'Home of Golf' where golf was first played 600 years ago. It remains a real test of golf for today's champions and amateurs alike!

The fabled original links course is synonymous with The Open Championship which it has hosted more times than any other venue and will host again in 2015.

Players will be based at the Links Clubhouse where there are changing facilities and clubs for hire. Refreshments will be available here. When players are ready, they will be transported to the first tee to meet their caddy and tee off on the most famous 1st hole in golf

Transfer time from Dundee to the clubhouse is 30 minutes. Allow 5 hours to play the course.

- Glamis Castle, the fairytale castle and home to the Queen Mother
 - Scone Palace where Kings were crowned

This tour explores the Royal history of Perthshire, a region north of Edinburgh, packed with important and grand stately homes. The journey to the first stop, Glamis Castle is around a 30 minute transfer from Dundee.


Glamis Castle is the pretty childhood home of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother. Visitors approaching the Highland Castle with its fairy-tale spires cannot but draw breath in admiration as they journey down the awesome mile-long avenue. A private Castle tour will invite the guests to admire the rich varieties of furnishings, tapestries and works of art contained in its many State Room and Royal Apartments each steeped with history and stories of legends and royalty. A breathtakingly beautiful place of power and mystery and the rightful home of the celebrated Stone of Scone - also known as the Stone of Destiny - now housed in Edinburgh Castle.

Gleneagles is known as the "palace in the glen" and just 40 minutes drive from Dundee. The stunning countryside setting is perfect to enjoy a selection of country sports. The oldest distillery in Scotland, home of 'The Famous Grouse' is close by and offers a very warm welcome

Gleneagles is a 40 minute journey from Dundee and on arrival; guests will be served morning coffee. After the activities, lunch will be served in the hotel. Afternoon tea is available at the distillery.

The sporting options:

Scurry Driving at the Equestrian Centre includes a lively and enjoyable competition. Test your skills around a tight course of cones while being scored against your accuracy and speed. Instructors will provide one-to-one tuition in the rudiments of scurry driving, and double reins allow dual control of the carriage so novice drivers can relax and enjoy the ride.



The Falconry School offers guests the rare opportunity to learn how to handle and fly hawks. A lively and informative flying demonstration, including eagles, hawks and a falcon will be followed by handson instruction. These magnificent birds are superbly trained but still retain their natural instinct to hunt and kill. The session will allow you a fascinating insight into the world of falconry.



The Gundog school at Gleneagles is the first school of its kind in the world. Guests can learn how to handle a trained gundog. This unique opportunity is inspired by Scotland's great sporting heritage, wherein Labradors, spaniels and other breeds have, for many centuries, partnered sportsmen and women in the field.



After lunch you will be transferred to Glenturret Distillery, just a 15 minute journey for a private tour and tasting session. The tour will take the guests around the production areas of this working distillery to learn about the whisky making process, to the warehouse where the whisky is left to 'sleep' and finally to the tasting rooms for a few drams of the 'water of life'.

St Andrews Cathedral & Castle (Half Day)



St Rule's tower provides access to spectacular views







