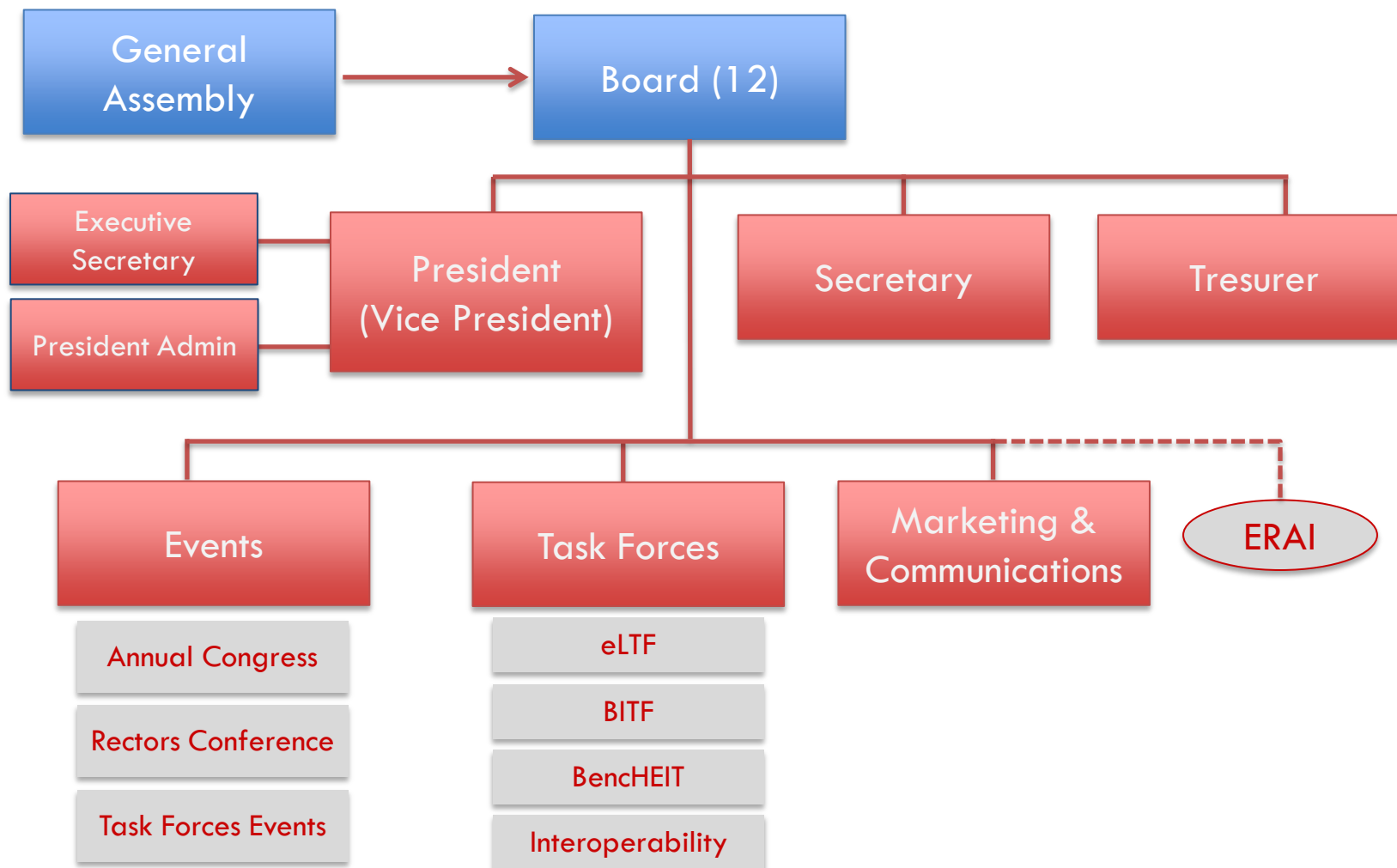

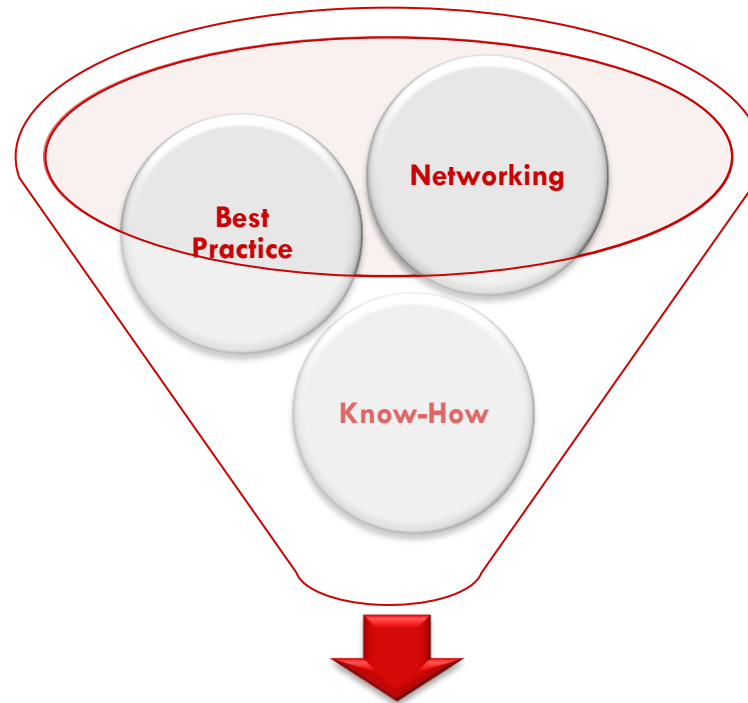

ERAI - What to do and Why



To speak with one voice and represent Europe

To identify common issues and work on them together

To cooperate with the EC for the development of EHEA



ERAI: where we want to get

- Being the “trend setter” or the “go-to place” for the European HE CIO when they want to have the most professional information available
- ERAI should be a tool to:
 - Predict
 - Plan
 - Make the case for IT
- Being the “voice of Europe” for HE IT (for both international org. and national org.)
- Providing analysis on European Higher Ed IT: our own works; compare national analysis with a European perspective



ERAI: what we already have

- A large community
- Papers from events (since 1997)
- Publications/surveys/reports from Task Forces
- Support to national bodies in distributing local surveys/analysis



ERA1: what we need

- **Short terms (by the end of the fiscal year 2014/15):**
 - Define the scope, working group
 - Funding
 - Engage the community: national organisations for surveys, analysis, funding and acceptance. Single members for contributions and papers.
 - A dedicated section within EUNIS' website
 - A Journal/Online Magazine
 - Collect information on analysis and research already run at international level
 - Event march 2015
- **Long terms (from August 2015):**
 - To do at least 2 researches per year run by EUNIS
 - To have at least 1 case study per month
 - To have at least 1 Task Force's report every 4 month
 - To have at least 1 interview per month (being alternatively collective (on a topic) and in-depth (one person))
 - To collect articles every 6 months + congress special
 - Providing a time plan of all national surveys conducted each year
 - National surveys: 1 annual analysis of all the national surveys run in each country to create a European overview; promotion and distribution of national surveys in third countries (translation (?); adaptations; know-how)
 - European TOP 10 Issues
